# RESTRICTION OF MOVEMENT ORDER

IMPLEMENTED UNDER THE PREVENTION & CONTROL OF INFECTIOUS DISEASES ACT 1988 & THE POLICE ACT 1967

IN EFFECT FROM MARCH 18 - 31

## PROHIBITS:



- The movement of persons & mass gatherings e.g. religious, sports, social & cultural
- All places of worship must close & halt activities including the Muslim Friday prayer
- All business premises except supermarkets, public markets, sundry & convenience shops must close



- Malaysians from going overseas
- Those returning from overseas must undergo a medical examination & self-quarantine for 14 days
- Foreign tourists/visitors banned from entering the country



- The operation of nurseries, government & private schools e.g. day schools, boarding schools, international schools, tahfiz centres & pre-university institutions
- Includes public & private higher education institutions, as well as skills training centres



- The operation of non-essential public & private premises
- Essential services like water, electricity, telecommunications, postal, transportation, irrigation, oil, gas, fuel, lubricants, broadcasting, finance, banking, health, pharmacies, the fire brigade, prisons, ports, airports, security & defences, cleaning, retail & food supplies allowed to remain open



- Drastic immediate action is required to stop the spread of COVID-19

- Everyone in Malaysia must comply with the order

# MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER



• Mass gatherings **banned**



• Businesses and places of worship **closed**



• Learning institutions and centres **closed**

- Foreigners **barred** from Malaysia.
- Malaysians barred from travelling abroad. Arrivals to undergo **health screening** and **self quarantine** for 14 days



• All non-essential services **closed**

*\*Essential services to remain open are water, electricity, telecommunications, post, transport, oil and gas, banking, healthcare, pharmacies, prisons, ports, airports, security, defence and food*

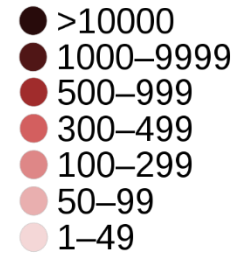

## Efforts to contain Covid-19 outbreak

■ **Government and private offices** except those involved in essential services to be closed



■ **Restricted entry** for foreign visitors



■ **No religious activities**



■ Those **returning from overseas** to be **home quarantined** for **14 days**



■ All shops **except businesses dealing with daily essentials** to be shut down



■ **No social gatherings**



■ **Comprehensive restriction** for Malaysians travelling abroad



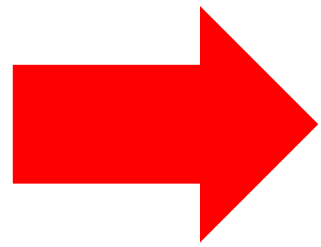
■ **Kindergartens, schools, colleges and universities** to be closed







# March - September 2020



**462** cases : investigation papers opened

**17** cases : in relation to corruption and bribery in the COVID-19 response and recovery

**7** cases : charged in special courts for corruption cases nationwide

**6** cases have been convicted

## ON-GOING AND COMPLETED INVESTIGATIONS INVOLVED CASES:

- bribery in provision of medical services;
- abuse of power in diverting relief aid and stimulus packages;
- fraud related to falsified medical protective equipment (i.e. face masks, glove, etc
- bribery of enforcement officers who enforce the movement control order etc.

# PREVENTION: Inspection and Consultation Division, MACC



## PREVENTION

MACC's functions: Section 7 (c), (d) and (e) of the MACC Act 2009

- ❑ **2 advisory papers** : emergency procurement system pertaining to COVID-19
- ❑ **28 inspection papers** : inspect system and procedures and policies in regard to provision of medical services and protective equipment

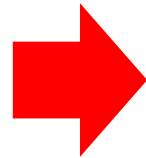
