


Number of corruption-related reports received has decreased





To combat corruption through swift and sure, firm but fair action


High & consistent clearance rate



Explanation: Clearance rate refers to the total number of subjects whom CPIB has completed investigations, out of the total number of subjects investigated by CPIB in the year.




Small number of public sector employees prosecuted in Court


