





NACC POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS



- The NACC proposed anti-corruption policy recommendations to the Cabinet with an aim to prevent misappropriate use of government loan funds for COVID-19-related projects.
- These projects include the procurement of medical equipment and supplies, the spending of financial aid granted to the affected stakeholders, and for the economic and social rehabilitation.
- On the 15th of September this year, the Cabinet has approved the NACC's proposed recommendations and circulated those recommendations to relevant agencies, including the Ministry of Finance and the Bank of Thailand, for further implementation.



To date, **over 80 complaints** have been reported to the NACC from each region of Thailand in relation to alleged irregularities as a result of the pandemic. **55** of the allegations are in preliminary inspection stage, while **three** of the allegations are being investigated and **one** allegation has already reached a resolution by the NACC.





Most of the recent complaints are related to the procurement of COVID-19-related medical supplies

- purchase of substandard or overpriced goods
- cases of questionable conflict of interest between private contractors and public officials.





Allegation's Resolution

Provincial Administrative Organisation in the north of Thailand

has been alleged of its budget spending on overpriced essential items (care-set) for the elderly during the COVID-19 pandemic in the amount of 16 million baht, which equals to over 500 thousand US Dollars.





On-going Investigation


Provincial Administrative Organisation in the northeastern region

has been alleged of its budget spending of over 7 million baht to enter into 3 procurement contracts on the same day for the purchase of disinfectant solutions to prevent Covid-19.
